Call to order/Roll Call

L. Marx calls to order the meeting at 11:32 AM ET

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Review and Adopt Agenda

- Committee reviewed the agenda; Chair Marx called for a motion to adopt the agenda.

Review Rules of Finance Committee

- N. Kalfas gives a brief overview of Finance Committee processes.
- Budget is a proposed draft the initial year
 - Proposed draft budget gives a general idea of what commission needs to function
 - Build draft, then send to executive committee, then it will be sent to the full committee

Funding Update

J. Thomas shares that there aren't any official updates, conversations are ongoing.
G. Thomas shares that it's likely that the initial funding will be from NCCPA and AAPA. NCCPA is having discussions at the board level, meeting in February. NCCPA is prepared to approve \$150,000.
K. Scarbalis shares that AAPA is meeting in March. They'll have more information in early 2025.

Question- How much HRSA is left for this project?
\$50,000 this year, \$50,000 next year. This is not on a calendar year. This year's HRSA money is expected to last through February.

Draft Budget

- L. Marx explains draft budget. Discusses placeholders.
N. Kalfas gives breif description of what other compacts have done for a secretariat and ED.
- For full secretariat services, no less than \$120,000 annually.
 - For minimal services such as bank account and book keeping, \$25,000 annually.
 - In-kind secretariat services from an affiliated organization such as PT and Nursing.

Questions posed regarding the draft budget
Can CSG continue services on a temporary basis? Yes, CSG will get information about costs.

58 What do the highlighted cells mean? We don't have enough information yet to fill them.
59 What type of calendar is this? Using the federal fiscal year for this example but the executive committee
60 will need to set a fiscal year for the compact commission.

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62 L. Marx summarizes some future steps including identifying processes needed, software needed. Calls
63 for a meeting to settle some of this information and send the proposed draft budget to executive
64 committee, preferably in December so that the budget can be sent to funders.

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66 CSG will gather actual budget reconciliation and estimates for continued CSG services.

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68 Committee will try to meet before the next executive committee meeting (Dec 11) in order to get a
69 proposed draft budget to them for approval.
